x What is IRB?

The Institutional Review Board was created to protect human subjects participating in research. At Jackson State University, the IRB's intention is to:

- x Minimize risk to research participants;
- x Ensure participants have given their consent after being fully informed of research procedures and risks;
- x Promote equity in who is asked to participate.
- x When should I submit an IRB application?

One should submit an IRB application when they are interested in conducting research that involves human subjects, including utilizing/analyzing human subjects' data whether it is human tissue, cells, estudents

Examples bosuch methods include:

- x Interviews
- x Surveys
- x Questionnaires
- x Focus groups
- x Interaction/interventions with individuals
- x Using data that has been collected from the aforementioned hods, i.e., census or NHANES
